PLANS AND PROTOCOLS FOR CONDUCTING THEATRE CAMP

Dear MNDT Kids Camp participants and families,

We are very excited to welcome students in all our sessions ranging from grades 3 - 8 in our Summer Kids Camp hosted by the MND Theatre Program. The camps run in 3 sessions.

3 rd Grade – 5 th Grade	July 06 – 10, 2020	9:00 AM – 3:00 PM
6 th Grade – 8 th Grade	July 13 – 17, 2020	9:00 AM – 3:00 PM
6 th Grade – 8 th Grade	July 20 – 24, 2020	9:00 AM – 3:00 PM

For the health and safety of all participants and staff members, MND has outlined the following plans and protocols that are in alignment with recommendations of the Ohio Department of Health and are in accordance with timing guidelines provided by Governor DeWine and the Responsible Restart Ohio Initiative.

SPACING – ENTRANCE PROCEDURES – SYMPTOM CHECK – PARTICIPATION

Capacity and Dedicated Spacing


- Sessions for participants will be held in classrooms on the 3rd floor of the school.
- The ratio of camp participants to staff member or counselor will be limited to 9.
- Sections may be marked off to create “windows” so that each participant can stay within that dedicated space to meet social distancing requirements.
- There will be signage and verbal reminders to maintain the proper safe distance.

Entering /leaving/hand sanitation

- There will be someone at the entrance to assist with entry. Participants should arrive no earlier than 15 minutes before the start time. They will be admitted and dismissed one at a time.
- Participants and staff members will be required to use the provided hand sanitizers or wash their hands before entering the facility, after breaks, and upon returning from outside. Only one person will be permitted to go to the restroom at a time to ensure social distancing.

Symptoms Check

- The graphic below posted by the Ohio Department of Health at <https://coronavirus.ohio.gov/> is provided to enable each participant to check for/be aware of COVID 19 symptoms. Before entering the building, each participant will be asked about symptoms and may be required to have a temperature check. If any individual has a fever of 100 degrees or higher, the individual may not enter the facility.



- If a participant or adult supervisor is experiencing any of the symptoms or knowingly has been exposed to COVID-19 she/he will be required to stay home. If anyone is suspected of having or confirmed to have COVID 19, the proper protocol as directed by the Ohio Department of Health will be followed.

Participation and Congregation

- No parents/spectators may come to camp sessions.
- “No touch rule” is in effect. Participants should not have physical contact besides an “elbow bump”. There will not be activities that require physical contact with one another. Counselors will also adhere to the “no touch” rule by providing only verbal instructions and feedback.
- The participants will not be allowed to gather in the foyer, outside of the school building, or anywhere on the school premises before or after camp.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS – SANITATION – ENVIRONMENT

Personal Belongings

- Participants will bring their own *essential*/belongings. MNDT provides each participant with a script and a Theatre Camp a t-shirt which they will receive on Friday. Participants will keep their belongings in a designated area of the classroom away from the belongings of others and will be required to take them home and sanitize. Personal belongings may NOT be left in the building. There will not be a lost and found bin in operation and MND will not be responsible for lost items.
- Participants must bring their own snack, lunch and a water cooler with adequate water and ice for hydration. Per state guidelines, water fountains will be disabled, and ice machines will not be available except for injury. We suggest bringing ample amount of water as we are not able to refill.

Sanitization/signage


- The MNDT Counselors and staff will sanitize MND equipment after use.
- There will be hand sanitizer available to use upon entering the building and before leaving the camp session area.
- There will be signage inside the camp areas indicating that social distancing is required as well as reminders about using hand sanitizers and proper cleaning of equipment.

Other considerations

- Face coverings are not mandatory, but they can be worn at the discretion of each individual staff member or participant.
