- CSQ of 125 or above on the High School Placement Test

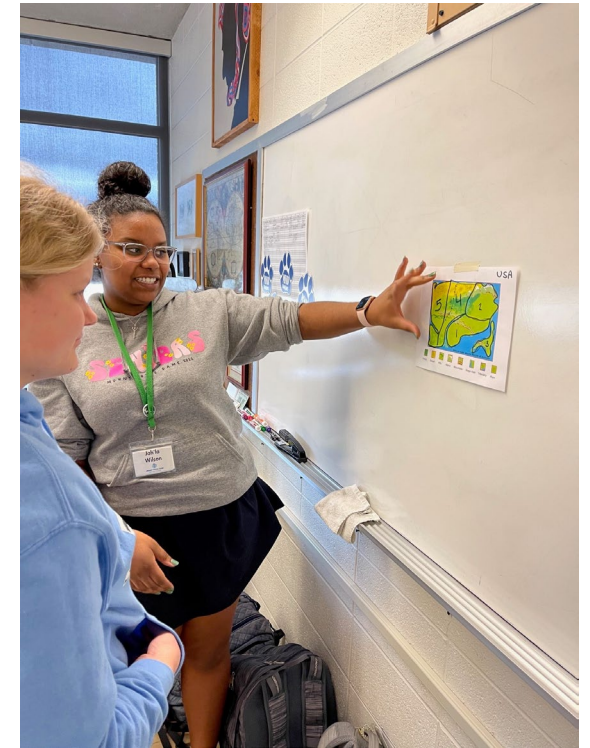
# Billiart Scholar Benefits



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## Honors/Advanced Placement®/CCP Schedule

- Billiart Scholars begin in Honors and Advanced Placement (AP®) courses as freshmen
- Opens access to our 20 Advanced Placement courses during their four years and 12 College Credit Plus (CCP) courses.



## Billiart Scholar Benefits



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### Accelerated Testing Program

- Billiart Scholars participate in a specialized, accelerated standardized testing schedule. The schedule provides accelerated exposure in preparation for the PSAT, ACT and SAT.





## Billiart Scholar Benefits



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### **Monetary Academic Scholarship**

- Scholarship amount to be determined
- Is consistent for all students in the cohort

### **EXAMPLE: Class of 2027**

- \$2,500 4-year renewable academic scholarship
- \$10,000 overall





# Experiential Learning



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## Freshman Year – Career Speaker Series:

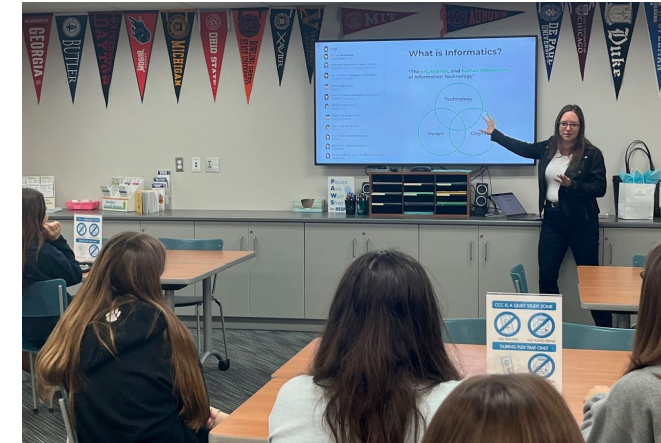
- Students engage and network with alumnae and friends of MND who share their experiences and challenge students to consider future career pathways.

## Sophomore Year – Philanthropy Project:
