


• Scoring in the 90th percentile or above on the High School Placement Test

Billiart Scholar Benefits



Honors/Advanced Placement®/CCP Schedule

- Billiart Scholars begin in Honors and Advanced Placement (AP®) courses as freshmen
- Opens access to our 20 Advanced Placement courses during their four years and 12 College Credit Plus (CCP) courses.





Billiart Scholar Benefits



Accelerated Testing Program

• Billiart Scholars participate in a specialized, accelerated standardized testing schedule. The schedule provides accelerated exposure in preparation for the PSAT, ACT and SAT.



Billiart Scholar Benefits



Monetary Academic Scholarship

- Scholarship amount to be determined
- Is consistent for all students in the cohort

EXAMPLE: Class of 2027

- \$2,500 4-year renewable academic scholarship
- \$10,000 overall
