


The Notre Dame Learning Community Advantage

Established in 1860 by the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, Mount Notre Dame is one of Cincinnati's oldest all-female Catholic schools. MND belongs to the worldwide Notre Dame Learning Community with 124 schools in the United States, England, Scotland, Guatemala, Congo, Zimbabwe, South Africa, China, Japan, Italy, Kenya, Nigeria, Brazil, Peru and Nicaragua.

Our dedicated faculty and staff continue to follow St. Julie Billiart's directive – "Teach them what they need to know for life" – through rigorous academics, opportunities for personal growth and a values–based Catholic education.

Our Campus

Block Scheduling

Academic instruction is enhanced through our collegiate-style block scheduling. We utilize a block schedule to help ease the transition from high school to college scheduling. In our A/B Block schedule, classes meet on an alternating day rotation, allowing students a day between classes to complete homework, ask questions and prepare for tests. In addition, longer classes allow more time for collaboration, class projects, test-taking as well as laboratory and artistic work.

C Days are academic days that may include a variety of additional experiences such as sisterhood bonding time, Mass and prayer services, presentations, service projects, goal assessment, pep rallies, career exploration seminars and individual student check-in time.

Premier Programs

Billiart Scholar Program

This advanced academic program inspires students to grow by engaging them through real-world experiences and challenging them to think beyond the classroom. Freshmen selected for this program will receive a monetary scholarship and enroll in Honors English, Honors Math, Honors Biology and AP Human Geography.

My Action Plan (MAP)

Our unique four-year MAP Program allows each student to develop her individual capabilities to learn, live, lead and serve. Each student is paired with a staff member MAP guide who welcomes her into the community, assists her in the transition to high school and invites her to begin her path to empowerment. Each grade level focuses on a different aspect of the MND mission, culminating in the Senior Capstone.

Road To College

The Road to College is a partnership between MND, our students and parents/guardians that begins on the first day of a student's freshman year. Our counselors offer a personalized approach that ensures each student arrives at her best destination following graduation.

Student Services

Counseling

Our four full-time M.Ed licensed counselors design and implement a comprehensive counseling program for students. By partnering with students and families for the four-year journey, counselors cultivate relationships where each individual is empowered to balance her educational goals and the growing need for independence with the demands of school, family and friends. With a continued commitment to mental health wellness, we also provide a full-time M.Ed social worker with LISW credentials, who provides additional support and programming for students. In addition, our testing coordinator serves the needs of our young women navigating through the ACT, SAT and other standardized tests. Our Counseling Department is further supported by a therapy dog, Hank, who is on-site regularly to provide animal-assisted intervention visits.

Academic Support

Our collaborative team includes two interventionists, a math specialist and a speech and language pathologist who empower students to enter the world after high school as prepared advocates who are well-versed in their learning needs and able to succeed on the path they choose.





Spiritual growth, service experiences and Christian leadership come alive with the guidance of our Campus Ministry team. We express our strong Catholic identity in a three-faceted approach to spiritual development:

A sisterhood bound by shared experiences

Students who attend Mount Notre Dame become part of a distinguished legacy steeped in history, sisterhood and tradition. For over 160 years, young women have called MND home, with each student contributing to the unique fabric that creates the MND community.

Province System

The MND Province System, named as a nod to the provincial structure of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, serves to unite groups of students from all grade levels into a "province" with subsets of each province known as "communities." Communities have replaced the traditional single-grade homeroom model and students remain in the same community for all four years. By blending grade levels into one community, we are fostering sisterhood and shared experiences between the four grade levels.





TRADITIONS

RooHa

Our signature spirit event, RooHa celebrates the spirit and joy of MND with students joining together in worship, community and friendly competition.

Senior Dance Marathon

An overnight experience where the entire senior class learns a choreographed dance routine to be performed in front of the entire student body the following morning.

GAA Nuns

Our legendary Girls Athletic Association is known for their epic-themed pep rallies. Members of this spirited club take charge in leading the MND student section during athletic games wearing their signature nun habits. No MND student section is complete without them!

MND School Song

Our beloved school song has been sung by students for nearly 100 years. Significant MND events culminate with students linking arms and joyfully singing together - "To the glory of Mount Notre Dame!"

MND All-Girl Advantage

We are experts in educating young women. There are no limitations to what our student leaders can accomplish. MND is a living example of the research which tells us young women who attend an all-girls school have greater self-confidence, higher expectations and are challenged to achieve more.

Academic Achievement

Tailored Curriculum: All-Girl schools can design curriculums that cater specifically to the learning styles and interests of female students, improving engagement and performance (Hoffmann, Badgett, & Parker, 2020).

Empowerment and Self-Esteem

Supportive Environment: A community focused on female empowerment helps students develop a strong sense of self-worth and resilience (Caldas & Bankston, 2019).

Social Development:

Close Friendships: All-girls environments often foster close, supportive friendships, contributing to a positive school experience (Bouchard, 2019).

Leadership Opportunities

Greater Participation: Girls in single-gender schools are more likely to participate in leadership roles, sports, and extracurricular activities, enhancing leadership skills (Sullivan, 2018).

College Preparation:

Higher College Acceptance Rates: Some studies suggest that graduates of all-girls schools have higher college acceptance rates compared to their co-ed counterparts (Jackson, 2016).

Alumnae Networks:

Strong Networks: Graduates of all-girls schools often benefit from a robust network of alumnae who can provide mentorship and career opportunities (Sullivan, 2018).
