Our History

Established in 1860 by the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, Mount Notre Dame is one of Cincinnati's oldest all-female Catholic schools. St. Julie Billiart, one of the foundresses of the order, is known for saying "How Good is the Good God!" This goodness is celebrated every day in the MND school community. It is seen in the interactions among the students, faculty and staff and is an obvious presence throughout the hallways. An MND student exudes joy in knowing that "God is good." Celebrating the All Girl School Advantage

Girls take center stage at Mount Notre Dame. There are no limitations as to what our student leaders can accomplish. MND is a living example of the research which tells us young women who attend an all-girls school have greater self-confidence, higher expectations and are challenged to achieve more.*





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MND provides a college-preparatory learning environment with an average class size of 19 students. Led by a talented faculty, each student is challenged by a rigorous academic curriculum, including 26 Honors courses, 20 Advanced Placement (AP) courses and numerous on-campus College Credit Plus (CCP) courses. Instruction is enhanced through collegiate-style Block Scheduling and the One-to-One Tablet PC Program that supports a variety of learning styles.

Each student forms a four-year relationship with her school counselor who helps her select courses, explore colleges and careers and transition through the high school years.

Student support is provided by four school counselors, a health and wellness counselor, a testing coordinator, teachers and faculty. Additional assistance is available through our Intervention Department faculty. This team serves as a valuable resource to students, parents and teachers in implementing the student's educational plan.

MY ACTION PLAN (MAP)

Mount Notre Dame is committed to helping each student reach her potential. Our unique four-year My Action Plan (MAP) Program challenges each student to develop her individual capabilities to learn, live, lead and serve. A staff member MAP guide welcomes each freshman into the community, assists her in the transition to high school and invites her to begin her path to empowerment. The MAP Program includes cross-curricular activities in the sophomore year, leadership opportunities in the junior year and culminates in a senior year Capstone Project.

Each year every student also creates and reviews academic, spiritual and personal goals. Goalsetting is a collaborative effort involving the student, faculty, MAP guide and counselor.

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Global experience opportunities set MND apart from many other schools in the area. These opportunities teach students respect for all people, increase their worldview, and equip them with skills to navigate the world.



MULTICULTURAL STUDENT UNION (MSU)

Learn a little. Change a lot. Grow together. The MSU advocates for the multiculturalism of the MND community. Established upon the Hallmarks of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, members of the MSU strive to spread knowledge, understanding, and acceptance of all cultures and ethnicities throughout the MND community, and provide a safe place for all people to come together in peace. MSU focuses on educating members on the differences within our own communities, building community among its members and providing activities and educational facts for the entire MND community.

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Mount Notre Dame collaborates with Catholic schools in Zaragoza, Spain, Belfort, France and Santiago, Chile. MND exchange students attend classes while living with an international family, and then host their Spanish, Chilean and French "sisters" here at home. This is an excellent way for a student to experience the language and be immersed in the culture of another country.

JAPANESE PROGRAM

Mount Notre Dame participates in a cultural exchange with the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur affiliate school, Seishin Girls' High School, in Niigata, Japan. Students spend two weeks visiting cultural sites in Tokyo and Niigata, including temples, shrines, theme cafes and the Ghibli Museum. They also attend classes and learn about the Japanese educational system.





SERVICE LEARNING

Throughout the school year students can spend an extended weekend building relationships in Liberty, KY, Columbus, OH, or right here in Cincinnati. During the summer, longer versions of these same trips are available as well as an international trip to El Salvador. Service and cultural immersion experiences are explored annually to provide a variety of opportunities.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS PROGRAM

Students participating in Model United Nations cultivate an appreciation for the global community around them as they simulate an official UN conference. Acting as delegates from different countries, students debate a topic of world concern while representing their country's position. A peaceful resolution is reached through debate, negotiation, and compromise. Mount Notre Dame participates in local, national and international experiences, providing students the opportunity to discuss world affairs with high school students from around the world.

GLOBAL LEARNING TRIPS

Faculty members offer global opportunities for students during the summer. Such trips have taken students to adventures throughout the U.S. and Europe.
